Why there's so many different matters. Oh, my Lord, it matters when they're pulling souls out of bodies that people have to in the morning. It needs to matter. It needs to matter to every researcher in it. I mean, we we need to, you know, obviously discuss this in a deeper context. I facial research, and we needed to get into this depth because actually, it's happening. We don't know how to stop it. You know, these abductions, all throughout history, we've tried to find different ways and rituals to stop what's happening to our species. Sometimes it works, but largely the data is inconsistent. And so we are at a disadvantage. because in many ways we're being invaded by the impossible. Now, with respect to the origin of the demonic, there are two theories that have dominated demonology. Number one being that these entities are fallen angels. Now, that's that's a tradition. But but the data speaks to them being something completely different, or at least that we, as researchers misinterpreted what a fallen angel was to be. Now, the second idea of the origin of demons is that the demon is the DIS corporate, dis incarnate body of that individual, a person that lived and died, sometimes through trauma. If they are, even through suicide, or some was somehow when they died, there was a void in them, that left them in what's called a liminal state. And so the ancient idea, this particular ancient idea, demonology is that when people had a peaceful death or a good death, they would evolve. If they did not have a good death, they would evolve or they would mutate into

something that would return to the house or return to victims and manifest in an ugly way. So what I have decided that with my research is that the least this is my personal opinion that the data that speaks to a fallen angel is it is not there. I don't think it's ever been there. We're not dealing with entities that have lost their wings, and you know, they're there, they can't fly anymore. No, that's all in the show ology. But when you get down to the texts, I mean, guys, look up Numbers chapter 19, and 11. This is where we get the extra cystic right, where your Catholicism gets their holy water. But this is this very segment that will make sure you guys remember that that particular test is not about fallen angels, it's about when somebody comes in contact with a dead person. And so what happened is our ancient exorcist evolved with that text and said, it's not just coming in contact with the corpse, but coming in contact with the spirit that was once in it, the consciousness that once animated that body. And so then what happened we had people become possessed by the consciousness that left that corpse. And so then your priest would have to go to Numbers chapter 1911, and fulfill that ritual. Now throughout history, your exorcist said and especially Catholicism said that this is a this is a ritual to cleanse somebody from being possessed by a fallen angel. That's not scriptural. Government scriptural, that is designed to cleanse somebody from literally a ghost common baiting their consciousness, coming during weather, and possessing their bodies. And so your ancient given ologists, especially in your Jewish demonologist, believed that was the first mention of even the concept of an evil man possessing someone now, what's fascinating is this points to Oh, it's crazy man. What's even more interesting about it in my mind is how that he says, placed over him a wicked man or set over him a wicked man, and place a Satan, not the Satan a satan. Yes. At his right side. No, the reason they say that is because this is going to Jewish demonology here is because they believe that when there was a possessing entity, resident within a person that they're attached to that entity, was a Satan, that was punishing that disincarnate person. And so they taught that the Satan was an accuser that it was lodged right next to the possessing entity. Now this what this is why the 16th this is just not the lecture, but we're getting into it. This is why the 16th century, while Catholicism was separating itself from their Jewish roots in terms of demonology Yep, they were basically solidifying the fact that Satan's a real entity with agency. But while that was going on, Isaac Luria in the 16th century was in a province in Israel called soft date. And he was telling his students that there are many of these episodes, people that are dead ghosts. And so it was during that portion of history where Catholicism is basically du de Judaizing its roots while while while Qabalistic extra systems were coming up with their own potions and whatnot, so my point here is that it's all consciousness. Now, possession first begin to idolaters, what idolaters would do is whenever they would have a, a family member, die, they, they would go out and they would go to an officer from that on set Chronicles talks about this, and they were creating an image and likeness of that deceased ancestor. And the consciousness of that ancestor would then step into that image. All right. Now, the reason was that this was not only in their mind, it wasn't just an image to them, but it was a way to self replicate their species. In addition to that, it was a way for them to stay alive in this dimension. Now, if you go to the golden bowl with James Fraser, James Fraser mentions another aspect of this, it's very interesting. If you're a fallen, you're not an angel. Just you know, and so what you get down to is this, this this, many researchers in order to understand what a fallen angel was, they have to

look at the belief system retrospectively. In other words, we have to look at what we believe now according to what we have, and then look back to them and say, Okay, this must be what they believe. Right? And that's a very, it's very troubling, and it's difficult to do. But anyway, so Genesis six is the King James Version leaves a lot to be desired. And so I started searching and going into ancient texts, trying to understand, okay, what really happened? I don't want to know, you know, I really didn't care if these angels were sexually attracted to the women. I don't care if it's remarkable or looking. Yeah, none of that matter to me, I wanted to know exactly how they manifested. You know, and so the Apocrypha of John was written and preserved by Egyptian monks that were Christians. And they had preserved this ancient texts, so that other people when they would read it, they would understand that how this occurred, not why it occurred. Not sometimes not even when or where, but how these entities manifested to the women. Now, in the Apocrypha of John, it says that these entities manifested to women in the images of their husbands Hello, aka does Hello UFO abduction phenomenon in many cases, and in the absence of the real husband, he's not in the room, you strong somewhere else, or he's deceased, these entities would manifest to the women in the images of someone they were intimate with. This is powerful. This gives you intent, it's very sticky here. And it says that at the moment of conception, they stared into the eyes of these women, and then reverse their apparitions to what they really looked like. In biblical antiquity, they believed that whatever man the woman was focused upon at the moment of conception, she would create a material image of through her womb as a child. Okay. So the son would be the material image of the father. Hello, oneness. I won't go there, throw that away. But what's happened is that again, if you look at this, you have an entity that is making a child look like its own apparition. Okay. Now why would they do that? Because you have a soul without a body. Now this gets into what Molokai mark would called perfect possession. Yes, perfect possession is not transient. It's not someone you know, it's not a man possessing a female, a woman and then talk it through or know why, because that man has an apparition it has what it looks like, it doesn't look like that female, right? It has, it's a memory. It's a belief system today. So what he says is we're dealing as they were creating bodies to inhabit. Okay, that's why that's why they were also called the ref Hyeme. And the Hebrew ref it was not just giants, but it means the deceased dead people, just like the the book, just like an idolatry and necromancy. And so what these entities were doing is they were creating what's called Social scans to possess and take over and in doing so they created a hybrid species called novoline. The Fall falling ones. Yes. It's very interesting. So so there's there's also an argument, okay, what to do with the angels are those their children, I believe they were the children. what I do as an investigative journalist and reporter, I consider a lot of these different things to kind of fall under the scope of unexplained mysteries, whether it's about UFOs, strange encounters, various issues about history and anomalous archaeology, and what we can learn about where we're going in space, and in the future. And all of these things, I think, tie into our collective curiosity, when it comes to what we're doing here in this world of our existence and what that means for us, and learning more about our reality and looking at what we can learn from science, and history and all of these things, spirituality, metaphysics, and maybe glean some insight from different people who have specialized in different fields or have backgrounds with experiences, or things that might help us understand what we're dealing with. And so I've taken a little bit of time, over the last decade or a little more now actually, to dive into some of these strange areas like you follow G cryptozoology, spectra ology parasitology, anomalous archeology, and a new field that I think is really emerging and kind of being brought out of the fringes and more into the forefront of what we're dealing with right now called Z Knology. And this is something that's been relegated more into things like science fiction or games, but what we're dealing with Zeno essentially, is meaning foreign or alien, as a Latin term. And Xin ology would be the study of aliens. And, you know, that's a very blunt way of putting it. But really, alien can mean, a lot of things. It doesn't necessarily just mean, extraterrestrial, biological entity, it could mean a nonhuman entity that doesn't necessarily have to have had originated on a physical planet. If there is some form of existence for life beyond the physical, then maybe that could fall into that category as well. And that that's just something that we're, you know, needing to really look more into scientifically to have some better, you know, understanding of

but what I think is important is that what we're dealing with, and our understanding of reality is now going to be challenged with a lot of the discoveries that probably have already been made, but maybe not publicized. And that's an important part about this work that I'm doing as well as the, you know, there are a lot of ways that I think things can be discovered. And that's important. But the ways in which those discoveries have been declared to the public and to the world, through media, or whatever authority has a really important sociological effect. It's something anthropological, and that to me, that's why I'm interested in this in the form of anthropology is that this is a way that this is affecting our culture or social understanding of reality. And when we present new information, like what we saw here four years ago already, and the New York Times talking about the investigation program, from the Pentagon that was looking into UFOs, and this something that's probably been going on, and many levels behind closed doors, in different agencies, this is just one that was revealed. And with something like that, it opened up people's minds to the to the reality that this is something that not only is just there and happening and but has been taken seriously. And that's not including the people, like many of us here who basically have been keeping up with this for a long time. And who's known about this subject and its details and its lore for years, we're looking at the people who are otherwise indifferent, who don't know anything else, and really just are waiting to be told, you know, really, that's kind of what we're, I think, dealing with this that with all the grassroots movements in an attempt to bring this into a better standard of awareness. I've almost found and even I'm somewhat reluctant to admit that. I don't think it's really just going to be the the big, even the biggest UFO conferences and things like that, that will get the attention of the mainstream. I think it really will be a combination of our big pillars and society of, of government, of science, of religion, of academia, you know, academics, and those really, those essentially I think are the big ones that will help teach Ancient or maybe generate interest in awareness in a different way than then preaching to the choir, so to speak. I mean, the ones that the conferences are already usually familiar or continuing their interest or knowledge and furthering it by attending. And in, you know, maybe that some people are coming for the first time, that's great, we need more people to attend these things. And I don't think it's to say that it's all in vain or nothing, that we should keep doing what we're all doing in these areas. But I think it's important to note that we would be naive to think that the general public is going to have their way orientation of reality persuaded by some UFO conference or something, you know, I think it's important that we look at the effects the effectiveness of government disclosure on any level of these topics. And not that I'm necessarily an advocate for any particular, you know, situation on that necessarily, it's just that we have to see that that's going to affect a lot of people in a way that even the ones involved with, you follow G might not be able to have the resources to do. And it's important that we can see that that's something that we can utilize, hopefully, in a way that won't be threatening, you know, to the effect of making people panic, or that there's mass hysteria is something major was to be revealed. Yeah, so to kind of get to your question about, you know, or telling of, sort of the work that I've been involved with, with the vortex, which is just the name of my media platform, I really like to investigate some of these mysteries in a way that, I think, has been an inspiration by my friend, the late Jim Marrs who he was an investigative reporter and writer and author on many books, and had done a lot of work on challenging issues over the years. And since he passed away, you know, I think I really not that, you know, that was, that was a big point, I guess, for many people. And I think, for anyone who knew him or knew of his work, it was important to see that he left to a powerful, you know, statement, and the legacy and, and looking into these things, through journalism, and through making sense of, of trying to document things and cite things and find ways to substantiate otherwise really challenging claims. So I like to really get into situations where we can talk to two people who have had experiences, sit down with them and discuss their involvement with some of these programs, or an encounter or whatever event had happened. So a lot of my segments are interviews that I talked with people that I sit down with,

right there face to face, and we have a casual dialogue. I also like to go on location at some places, and just kind of do what I can to do field investigations and look into some of these mysteries. And then there's also the presentations and other segments that I put on there that are maybe from these events and conferences and symposiums that we have the opportunity to go to and network and find out about things. So I've been to different events, mainly here in Texas, which is where I'm situated, but I like to be able to get to what I can elsewhere. And as far as my activity with it. Now, a lot of its archival, it's an archival process that I'm going through things that I've had for a while and just kind of updating. And I'm utilizing a lot of this material that I've been able to put together with these interviews and everything to transcribe for the purposes of this publication that you had mentioned earlier, a book that I'm working on getting out this year, we can discuss a little bit as well, because it does tie into the simulation argument, patient theory and all of that. But all of these different topics to me are very interesting. I think they help lend insight into how we can better understand our reality, through our investigations of them through pushing them in scientific scrutiny in a way that's not disregarding of them, but helps shed light on some really tough situations which otherwise, maybe haven't gotten the opportunity to be looked at in a way that serious and not ridiculed. And now with this, especially like the UFO issue out more in the public, it's allowed groups, scientists and figures to be having more accessible to look into and be involved with, again, without being ridiculed, and being able to kind of take a more serious approach, which I think is what we need. It's something that's demystifying and we have to basically get rid of all the nonsense that's out there, that is really muddying the waters when it comes to some of this, these issues and, you know, I try to be respectful of everyone. I don't necessarily agree with a lot of the people sometimes that I'll interview, sure. And I might not believe or or not believe, but it's not necessarily the point of what I'm doing. Personally, for me, it's necessarily something that I think I have to also be considerate of is that these are something that people will see and maybe find like guilty by association, just simply because I'm talking with someone or their ideas. And I think that's important to see, like, especially in media is doing the citizen journalism work that I'm doing, it's important that I at least, make some point to clarify just that, you know, I'm just sharing a perspective for people to see that is out there. That's a major work of anthropology. And I'm just gathering resources and information and data to be compiled. To share that this is these are viewpoints, claimed or made, or stated by those involved with this area with this culture of ecology, or cryptozoology or any number of these other issues. So to me, there's a lot of overlapping and correlative traits to how people go about looking at this sometimes it's it is a religious concept for some people, because a lot of it can be based upon belief, and a faith based attitude. And some people it's more nuts and bolts and scientific. Yeah. And I think it's important to see all the different eclectic viewpoints with these things, even in the UFO community. Yeah, and how it plays a role into our understanding. So I tried to capture those types of understandings and in ways that maybe would make sense on a relatable or personable level with the interviews that I do. And those are all. You know, I'm still uploading some from throughout recent years and just getting more content on there. There's no like, I guess, regular consistency right now, because I'm using a lot of it to try to get this book done. But it is a way that people can see and kind of keep up with one of the things that I've been involved with flip, which is the set is the vortex on YouTube.

But other times, it's a really difficult issue that, I think is important to see that there are there are a lot of people who have incredible experiences, who have never really shared or don't tell anybody and will never know about. But it's because of the ones that do share about their experiences and their alleged encounters and all of these things that we have something a little bit to go off of, in the way of trying to investigate these phenomena. And I think that this is a, I think it's something that we have to see is like a really big part of how to go about getting any information, because a lot of it is conjecture. And I think it's important to see that it's something that a lot of times it's chalked up to just hearsay or just, you know, a witness testimony or experience is only as good as you know, believing the person who's telling you because they might otherwise not have any way to prove it. And that's challenging because we we kind of have like a legal system in court where we use a jury sometimes to kind of determine the outcome. And if they can come to a consensus about something, it might have a certain ruling in the court. And it's interesting how maybe that were based upon just, you know, making assumptions or or, you know, an attempt to analyzing evidence and all of this and coming to a conclusion. And it might not always be the correct response, even though it will be a determination. That's, I think, a good example of how people operate, and our mind and our world our reality. If we see things in certain ways, and depending on the information that we view all of the world through, and the lenses that we see things through whether those lenses are a particular worldview, a political ideology, you know, a religious mode of perception and really, you know, I think you made a good point. And experience is something that gives someone the context of like our relationship with with something, that's something I think, can be difficult to really identify, depending on the mode of language that someone is using. And that's where I think religion does come in a lot of times, it's used as a way of communication, a language that we try to interpret experiences and things. And sometimes it doesn't mean that

those languages are fully encapsulating of what the real experience was. But we just we have something we can use to attempt to share concepts in general things. So you can only imagine when people of all places in the world are having maybe a similar experience, but their communication, their language that they use to share about it is limited to, you know, whatever, maybe they can say or is used to speak or convey it. And that's, I think, where religion comes in is, these are all just forms of communication that we are attempting to share. And they're their forms of interpretation based upon those experiences. And then it comes down to well, you know, how effectively can we communicate those ideas without there being distortion, you know, along the way, and I think, unfortunately, we've had a lot of distortion. And people, you know, a lot of times conflicts around the world are our big, you know, result of those distortions. So I think that it's important to see that everyone views the world in their own unique way. But usually, we all have sort of a lens through which we perceive it, like you and I were, are a big part of our lens, at least right now, on the show is like we're speaking English, that has a big part of our understanding of the world, because we we try to encapsulate things in the world into a physical word that we can share to other people, that sort of limits things in into that context. And English, you know, it's a crazy language, it can be colorful and poetic in some ways, and others is just like, it doesn't make any sense. Yeah, sometimes. So it's just one of those things that we're having to do the best we can with the language we're using. And sometimes it's not just language, it's, it's, you know, it can come down to things in pop culture, it can come down to just quick understanding of what we call common sense, which is still just a very much a cultural idea. So our cultural lenses help give us views in the world, they try to help give us a language and way to describe things. But even with something like UFOs, if something is being seen across the world, in different places, throughout history, we would probably interpret those things, whatever other types of phenomena are happening in whatever way that we currently we like would have been, at that time, perceive them in those cultures. And, and so I think that it's important to see that maybe we all have that individually. We have that as a society. And then we have maybe a more collective view of that altogether. And I like to refer to those things as a mythical mythical operating system. Or just mythos, for short, which is kind of the title of the piece that I've been working on. That's why I call it that is because we all individually have that we have our own mythos, we have a social one. And then we have maybe a world or collective one. And beyond that, maybe there's something about our reality that we can learn or find out that, you know, gives us some insight about what's really going on and maybe how these things that we're experiencing, help us understand what we currently perceive as a mystery. And to, you know, maybe where one day, it'll be more normalized, in our culture to have an understanding of something which we now kind of don't really have, like a good understanding of across the board. I mean, not that's not to say that people don't know what's going on, or don't understand their experience. But I think that we're talking about something that's like, widely accepted, it's demonstrable. It's something that you know, is it can be questioned, but it's something that you could see now, where, you know, things like, vehicles and automobiles and all this stuff from just the last like, just a cinched about a century, you know, have become commonplace. And if we can only extrapolate that into a, another century ahead of us, it will be hard to see how with things like Moore's law, which is a you know, computational theory of processing power and our ability to produce an engineered technology at exponential rates in just the last century. You You know, we thought maybe people could never achieve certain speeds of transportation and all of this, and now we're doing some incredible stuff. And who knows what's going on behind the scenes? I think that it just, it should open our eyes to the things happening. And the next century will be like a determining factor for where humanity is going. And I think that's a big part of what will, we'll understand and our ability to simulate these types of situations, which ties into this whole thing of simulation theory or the simulation argument, and what that means for us, because I think there are really important implications.

And I'll just say this as well, because you had mentioned the theologians with NASA issue, and that essentially, the effect that people of faith might experience based upon the reality of being basically revealed that something about alien life, you know, being revealed to us and how that will affect our reality. And so there's also a similar type of publication, I guess you could say that's been done about this called theological implications of the simulation argument. It's by Eric Steinhardt of William Paterson University. And so there are a lot of really interesting resources and big figures and scientific figures and proponents of different things that have chimed in on this whole simulation argument or simulation theory. And it's just interesting, again, nonetheless, to say it's not about just outright believing it or disbelieving it. But just to hear, okay, let's pay attention to why this has been such an interesting issue that's been picked up all over. And what we can do to maybe navigate some of these different things we're seeing in the media, and being said by major scientific saviors. And that's something I think would be interesting to get into as well.

And they were saying at that point, that within the next five years, Moore's law will collapse. And they were talking at that point about human versus Drone Racing League happening the next year. That kind of stuff where it was, like humans flying drones, and then automated drones against them.

THINK that even though what Moore's law, you know, with the power, the the processing power in certain microchips and circuitry that you know, the materials will change for in that amount of time. And that's the other factor that often isn't involved is that it's not really, the technology will obviously be updated. But it's not really just confined to a specific method of the materials that are used, that'll obviously have a big impact as well, when they find different ways to store information to use as, as channels for the information to be transferred. And we're finding out that some of the materials that we're making have changed the game for sure and processing power. And we're not using the same methods. And so it's put a bit of a kink in Moore's law, and the overall idea that we're going to use that same way of processing. And so now we're finding that there are different ways to process that. And just in a simple way, If we extrapolate that same concept, Moore's law into just overall technology, so the the efficiency of in which things are engineered and made and the materials that are used to do that, and to that contribute to the efficiency of the technology that we're using, whether it's for smart type technology, and for integrated technology, things that will essentially change how we interact in society, and change how these things will not only affect our own, like, perception of how to get information, but how we will be integrated with our own morphology as well, we can already see that there's argumentation going on, you can see that people like Elon Musk, who have the resources to invest in this are working toward things like neuro link, whether again, whether you agree with it or not, you we can't not acknowledge that that's happening, we can't disregard that. That's happening just because we don't want it to sometimes, and not to say I'm advocating for it or not. But I think it's important to see that serious research is being done into adapting elements of the digital landscape, and the technological advancements of bionics, with our own physiology into the sort of mented reality, you know, we get into these ideas of virtual reality, where you have a completely fabricated landscape, where as augmented reality is like normal reality with a layer built upon it, on top of it, so to speak, that you can perceive. So this would be like having some and I actually foresee this happening very soon, in some scaled consumer weigh, that we will probably soon have these glasses, that would be kind of the consumer grade product of where you could just put on some what would seem like sunglasses. And of course, this has been a big part of what we see in science fiction shows and movies forever. But in a simple way, you would have a heads up display, you'd have things projected onto the lens that show you your environment, things that are used. Now in military scenarios, I think that we also see these types of things and used in aviation, inside helmets. Yeah, I think that it's something that really is, you know, what we see mentioned in a lot of wisdom traditions from, you know, around the world, historically speaking, you know, with with a lot of traditions talking about the world as an illusion, or is a dream place or something that really kind of gives this impression that it's based upon this idea that it's not necessarily the main part of reality, but it's like an experience. And I think that if you consider, you know, from what we understand and those traditions to be along those lines, we can kind of tie that into what we now think of as the simulation argument, which was really kind of popularized in more recent times by professor of philosophy at Oxford, named Nick Bostrom, and he wrote a paper and this is kind of where this comes from. This is in this has been around for like 20 years now basically, but it was titled Are you living in a computer simulation? And the abstract of that article just mentioned briefly says this paper argues that at least one of the following propositions is true one, the human species is very likely to go extinct before reaching a post human stage to any post human civilization is extremely unlikely to run a significant number of simulations of their evolutionary history, or variations thereof. And three. In a computer simulation, it follows that the belief that there is a significant chance that we will one day become post humans who run ancestor simulations is false. Unless we are currently living in a simulation, a number of other consequences of this results are also discussed. So basically, what this means is that Bostrom considered that there may be ways that we can understand reality, looking at computational theory, he calls this the simulation argument, not necessarily the simulation theory. And the argument is, are we the aspects of if it's a simulation, what can we learn about it. But that's a whole other part of this idea that several other people I've now extrapolated from. So the whole idea maybe, that we know, and pop culture, I think, has done the best job of kind of touching people's mind. And this whole subject is the matrix. And of course, the matrix really did a great job, when it first came out. It's just ironic now with this new one, how it's sort of being reintegrated into pop culture. But what the matrix, right by was, it was just, you know, that there are ways that we can understand reality. And then there might be levels of reality beyond that. And that may be depending on our own perception, as conscious beings that we have the ability to understand things beyond, you know, what a place that maybe we once did. And that's a really simple way of trying to explain something like what's going on in the matrix, without getting all into the crazy details of like, what's going on in the story, and the plot and all that, but just to overall, think about how that affected probably more people and their understanding of what we now are kind of referring to as simulation theory of the simulation hypothesis gives us people, the general person contacts, like most people who've heard about the matrix, they might not know what it is, but they haven't seen it. Other than like, it's just about, you know, the reality isn't real or something, or they're trying to figure it out. That's about the basis of of like, anything that you would need to know about that.

But really, what it gets down to is that there are a lot of people who've really considered strong implications of simulation theory agreed book on the subject, yeah, is by Raekwon Virk, called the simulation hypothesis. And it's, it's just a few years old now. It's a great read. I got to cross paths with him a few years ago, but he authored this book, to really show that there are a lot of ways that we can understand how something like these different studies and things that have been done show that there may be some merit to what we're understanding and extreme science experiments and computational experiments. And it's really great. And yes, you've got Kurzweil

And people like Elon Musk have even chimed in on this whole thing, which you can see on you know, many YouTube videos and things have been mentioning, you know, that there are odds of one in billions that were in base reality, meaning we're in the actual organic universe reality, but that also, it could be that we are in simulations within simulations, which is referred to as stacking. This is kind of like the Russian doll type idea of things being stacked or nested within one another. And you know, being in video editing and sound engineering, you know, this, these are often terms we see use or stalking or nesting, you know, that you have as a concept of those little Russian dolls, which are called the matryoshka dolls. And this is really important because even in a lot of theoretical sciences, a lot of people have talked about different parts of this idea of simulation theory. Specifically Michio Kaku, who's a theoretical physicist, and I got to meet him a few years ago, but about physics of the future. And this was several years ago now, actually, but you know, now, he's, you know, kind of looked at the UFO topic differently than he did back then he's more on board. But aside from that, he has really opened up people to these ideas that makes it more tangible. He was a spokesperson for the Science Channel, but he often talked about the Kardashev scale Carter show was a Russian scientist who came up with this grade scale of types of civilizations type One would be as planetary collective civilization. And type two would be like a civilization that inhabited a whole star system and utilized all of its planets for resources or whatever it needed, you know, in balance. galactic civilization, kind of like the Empire and Star Wars or just, you know, whole galactic Yeah, Galaxy wide, you know, group. So we're not even type one. We're working on that. Some sometimes we're working on that. I guess. We're doing what we can I think to try to reach that point. Some people want to get there. Some people don't, I guess. And, you know, I think that what we're seeing in this strange idea of civilization levels is that there's a concept called a Matryoshka brain. And a Matryoshka, again, is the Russian dolls that are nested. So a Matryoshka brain when it comes to like science and engineering is essentially a planet or star level form of technology, meaning they take a planet, they take a star, and they engineer it into a computer that runs simulations, similar to like constructing a Dyson sphere. So this would be like, the capabilities of a type two civilization, who is extremely advanced, and who has, you know, inhabited several planets, and maybe, you know, and this is all very specific. I mean, it could be the civilization doesn't need to inhabit planets at all, but um, you know, to the effect that it's used in this particular example, and Matryoshka brain, like a planetary computer that's been constructed, or TerraForm, or even a star that has been tariff formed or, you know, turned into a computer. This is, you know, massive scales of engineering. Yeah. You know, a type two civilization would be capable of doing something like this. And so this is supposed to be the Matryoshka brain is supposed to be able to run simulations of other universes, you know, multiple ones. And

sometimes this is also referred to as a Jupiter brain. So, you know, take something like a planet, or Jupiter and turn it into a computer. And it runs simulations. I mean, this all sounds very bizarre, but these are like actual concepts that had been postulated, you know, and to simulations. The idea of simulated reality can be different for each type of simulation. Because, you know, if we're making simulations, we might make them based upon certain things. It could be that some something someone or something else made a simulation that we currently exist within, and that maybe if they aren't humans, or whatever it is, or they are, however, I would liken it to this. If if we are individual participants within a collective simulation or mythos, like I refer to a mythical operating system, you know, our collective world a reality might be that simulation, and if it's not humans that are running that, then maybe it's something else, I think we maybe could refer to those things in different ways. But whatever it is, is that just one collective entity or like a unified group, or a an individual, or are there like emissaries or they're like admins and moderators who can come in. And sometimes we're not supposed to see things that we do, or experience things we're not supposed to just like glitches in the matrix. You know, that was a big concept of that, that quote, specifically, put more this idea in people's minds than probably anything else, the glitch in the matrix, you know, that whole idea that something's going on reality, that just doesn't seem like it makes sense. And there's more to it. There's something kind of behind the scenes, the inner workings. And you know, it's something that also ties into the psychedelic realm as well. You have spiritual and psycho psychoactive experiences. People like Terence McKenna were heavily into these ideas, and even his brother. And there's a really great show on Joe Rogan. And a lot people can think whatever about him, and even Joe, again, whether you agree with him or not, he has been a major proponent of simulation theory. He talks with a lot of his guests about it, ironically. And the one that he did talk to was, was Terence McKenna, his brother, Dennis McKenna. And they went into a deep discussion about simulation theory and how his brother Terence McKenna was heavily you know, influenced by these ideas that when we are under the impression of these experiences that are either induced psycho actively spiritual, however, that we act, we can access these things to reality, the inner mechanisms, the so called holds, you know, gears and things that they're they're holding it all together, and maybe even the ones working on it. And that is fascinating to me, because this is something that I also really have delved into, you know, on a personal level. And I think that there is something that connects all of these ideas together these seemingly disparate, disconnected concepts that I think are actually connected, and we perceive them in different ways. And I think that early people in ancient cultures who were doing medicine ceremonies and shamanism, they were accessing these things, they were accessing the ability to interface with these parts of reality and these entities. That's exciting. It's frightening and exciting, because we don't know right now, what's what I think we're trying to piece together this weird puzzle about the simulation idea, using things that we see throughout history that just are peculiar parts of these traditions of mythology, and shamanism. And then we look at modern computational theory. And we also see, okay, these modern psychoactive psychedelic experiences, people are experiencing encountering these entities, they're describing the same things they're seeing also in abductee and contact T experiencers. things. And I think that what we're finding out is that there's their common threads that we need to start looking at, and a way that we haven't before. And consciousness, I think, is a big part of all of this. So that's and seeing how maybe, the simulation theory, even though it's easy to just sort of picture like the movie The Matrix, it might not really be like that so much. That's just a very specific version that you know, they had for the movie, but really, it could be that whatever is going on, it could be something based upon our understanding of physics and, and laws of nature that we know maybe about some things but we're still learning a lot that maybe we're finding, okay, this is showing us that there's some ways that our reality makes sense. And in some things it doesn't. And I think those mysterious things that happened that challenges our view we are so one encounters a nonhuman entity that goes to show like

something else is going on, there is a hidden layer to reality. Yeah, even within all bizarre experiences, whether it's parasitology the paranormal, you know, apparitions and specters. Whether people think they're ghosts or spirits or whatever, people are obviously encountering things that doesn't seem like they should be. And, you know, sometimes it is intentional. Sometimes it's not sometimes people are trying to communicate with the dead sometimes people trying to communicate with aliens. Yeah, sometimes people don't do any of that stuff. And they have this really bizarre experience. Yep. And, and grow what you said into any of those kinds of categories. But even having a tiger was very specific to you know,

Yeah, seems to be really what we call space. But really, these are just fields mediums of what we just loosely say is energy. But there's there's not really, you know, one good way to describe one of these things, but because we've, we've used so many terms throughout the years. What's interesting is that this is something that we see has a major quantum sciences now there's, there's so many great things to really see that I have a contributed at least some way to interpret some of these simulation concepts. One of them was a study done by Dr. Silas Beane, who was working with QED, which is quantum electrodynamics, and there's also QCD, which is quantum chromo, quantum chromodynamics, as well. And these are different ways of understanding, like quantum gravity and quantum mechanics at incredibly intense scales of existence. And anyway, what they were, the whole presentation that they were talking about discussing this study was saying was that at small levels, extremely discrete levels of existence, that they're finding that it's fuzzy, and that there is what we call a discretization. And for anyone who's into music, or sound engineering or anything like this, and Chris, you know, probably felt the same thing at some point, right? discretization to be discrete, you're actually going to, you know, think about this in a really interesting way. Because it's something that seems like an abstract idea. But when they're talking about discretization, at very small levels of existence, they're saying that we can only go so far we're zooming in to such a degree that it seems like we can't go any further than this. And this is this is either indication of, of one or two things, or maybe both. Number one could just be that our technology and equipment has its its own ability degrades as we continue to push it to the limits, meaning like, we just cannot go so far with our current limitations of technology. Here. That's we know that that is a factor. But aside from that, he said, If these are in fact correct, and that our technology is so much an issue is that this means that reality, in this sense, is not infinite, but rather it has a finite boundary, which could imply that we've hit the wall, so to speak of the simulation, and we found out where, you know, to start discretization and very, very quantum levels. That sounds like a really bizarre idea might not make a lot of sense to some people. But what they're talking about is, if you could zoom in into those micro levels of reality, some people think you can just keep going and keep going, keep going kind of a guess, like the matryoshka dolls. And you know, maybe we cannot sure, like this particular pyramid was saying that it seems actually that that's not the case. And we're finding the boundary, the confines of all of this that could point to a scientific affirmation of simulation. And so it's, it's curious, because then the question is, well, who, who made the simulation? And is the same who running the simulation? Or is someone else? And are we able to somehow also be in that same situation, if not now, at some point of being the author of and I it makes me wonder, you look at all of these things in the past, and this is where I think this draws my curiosity, all the ancient architecture. I mean, obviously, not all of it but a great amount of these megaliths and these enormous and and cons. These constructs that seem almost impossible to make are all made out of really interesting materials, granite, or

quartz style. And do you have metallic alloy? is like brass, gold. And these are conductive. And they're made almost as if they are made to be used as circuitry on a not a micro chip level, but like a macro level. And to me, it would seem to, to maybe be interesting to consider, okay, if if ancient people knew how to harness the grid of energy or whatever it is the the medium, the simulation, medium through which we exist in an energetic, you know, on a power level or energy level two harness to utilize to export, outsource, you look at some of these things like the obelisks, and that's essentially, you know, what some people think that they are, are like antennas, they're accessing some people think, okay, are they accessing a sort of dimension that's here of energy or power? Or simulated, you know, existence? Are the accessing it? Or are they producing it? Are the emitting a signal on top? Are they making an augmented layer on top of a natural form of reality? And it makes us wonder, you know, have we been given the keys so to speak? Or, you know, have we been given moderator capabilities, administrative capabilities? Are we hacking into these things? Are we like, you know, being put in our place by moderators that don't want us to know that they're there, it's really an interesting time to think about these things, because we're in the perfect place to conceptualize them to conceive of them because we these are like normal things. For us, technologically. We work on computers in a way that it's commonplace to understand network administration, systems, management, and to think of how maybe all of these ideas help us get a better picture about our own reality as a network of systems. And we look at geometry, we look at material existence, we understand this sort of holographic geometry, physical plane of existence based upon this sort of fractal pattern. And, to me, it's really interesting to see how that all kind of comes into effect that it could be that this this reality, this this universe, or nested set of universes, multiverse theory, whatever, you know, I think is interesting to consider that simulation argument kind of falls into that. And so one of the newer books that's just come out about all of this is called the simulated multiverse, and that's also by Rizwan Virk great work that he's doing. And you know, there are a lot of really big proponents of simulation theory, even like Neil deGrasse Tyson is, has commented on this quite a bit. And it's something that I think is an important part of not just their view, but what what pull that they have, or sway that they have over the general public, I think is the bigger point is that, you know, whether you disagree with them or agree or believe or not, you know, them coming out and making statements Yeah, as people for science should say something just like what you were mentioning earlier about the whole issue with NASA and the theologians and the whole it's like it's an anthropological work, you know, they're looking at how we face to face
