And as we talked about that, it was like, well, let's do Oklahoma, because you were just learning of some of the cases up there, things like, exactly, I've been diving into Oklahoma. So, yeah, so southwest territory is California, Nevada, Arizona, New Mexico, Texas and Oklahoma and Hawaii. So

we've got, I think it's seven or eight states, and Oklahoma is the only one right now that doesn't have a state director. The last state director retired, and so I will be the interim until I can find someone. And that's what I'm here for. I'm talking to you guys in Oklahoma, hoping to get some of you to sign up join us. Yeah, absolutely. And, you know, move on. Let's pop that website up again, just so everybody can find it, especially this section right here, the file report section that is, that is, I mean, we have a, we have a report section on curious research, on curious realm. There are numerous reporting systems out there. However, I will say MUFON is probably the oldest standing reporting system that is, that is there right now that has been continuously operating, continuous. That's what I was gonna say, the oldest continuous there. There are others out there that are, technically by name, older but, but this is the oldest continuing operating, and it's, it's pretty amazing the number of cases, especially there in in California, Southern California, which is your own district. The number of cases that you guys take in there is just massive, massive. Yeah, it's crazy. How it'll be like, Oh, it's quiet for a week, and then, boom, you just, you look, and you go, Oh, my God, there's 10 cases right now. They just all got submitted. Like, it must be in the air. Because that's kind of how it happens, you know. And there's, you know, Texas is huge. Florida is huge. They get a ton of cases. And, you know, in Southern California, and all of California, really, too. So

And if you live in Oklahoma and you're interested in the topic of UFOs, honestly, I mean, it's a must read, she gives you a good, solid background,

And she found like 73 cases of substance in the state of Oklahoma between in that time period, and Marilyn is just like an expert when it comes to all things UFO in Oklahoma. She's on Facebook. You can report to multiple agencies just because you reported to one like, you know, I reported to MUFON, which is how I ended up becoming a member, and how I ended up becoming a field investigator, like, mostly because, like, none of my friends care about UFOs, my partner, like, literally, his eyes glaze over when you talk about UFOs, like, you're just talking about a unicorn that you saw at the corner or something. You know, it's just not he's never seen anything supernatural parent, you know, he calls himself a UFO muggle. Like, he's just never seen anything like that, and it just doesn't process, you know, in his head. And so, like, the cool thing about MUFON, like, I remember, like, getting tears in my eyes at my first move on meeting only because I had never been in a room full of people who didn't doubt what I was saying, and who looked at me like I was serious and like what I was saying was interesting, and not like, come on, you know. And it's different now, because obviously there's been more hearings and things in the government and, you know, legitimate, respectable people coming forward that even my partner of 20 years. We have had people from NASA working for us, and police chiefs and cops and detectives. We have all these kind of people work for us. But like, I'm I'm the housewife that works for us too, because I have the time and the interest and the passion for it. So you don't have to have a degree in science or anything like that, we will teach you to identify the prosaics You're gonna if you join, move on and you take the field investigator test, you get the manual. You're going to be assigned to, like somebody who's been doing this for years. You're going to be mentored, and you're going to be like, I can't even believe what I can identify, like that. Now, you know what I mean, like, I know SpaceX, a bug, a satellite, the space station, Sirius, hoaxes, Chinese lanterns, like so many things, that when I first got here, I probably would have been like, Oh, what's that? But we have, like, you know, exciting years, like 2220 22 and 2023 there was higher than average. It was more like 120

But the cool thing about Oklahoma is you get everything from the SpaceX to the UFOs to contact experiences and cattle mutilation, which I don't see here in Southern California. in our content management system in Oklahoma. So let's talk about the craft, the the most commonly reported kind of craft in Oklahoma. So spheres, you know, a ball, a sphere, most popular, or more, most commonly reported. It's like 20% of our reports in Oklahoma are a sphere, but the other ones that are very popular in Oklahoma, or, you know, the most seen, most reported, are the circles, discs, star like objects and triangles. So then I started digging into some historical information. So between 1947 and 1969

the US Air Force project, Blue Book and other projects documented over 800 UFO cases within the state of Oklahoma. Why? I know that's a lot, right? I was like, whoa. I don't know how you know they're just reports. You know that some of them could be just prosaic or whatever, but, but that's a lot, I thought. And then there was a surge in sightings in 1977

and the move on files. So it was a case of interest. It was a historical case, meaning it was reported more recently, but it happened in the 70s, so it was a historical case when it was reported in the Hartshorn area

in Zimbabwe, and other encounters that are in Australia. So a young girl reported it her and her brother wrote a boarding school outside of Harts, Oklahoma in 1974

there were at least 12 people there. She said, 10 of them were kids, two were adults. It was around five or 6pm and they noticed an object up near the clouds that was hovering and moving very slowly. As the craft got closer, they could see more detail. Was definitely a disc that had lights going all the way around the middle of the rim. The craft was guesstimated to be between 30 and 45 feet in length. It got down to about 60 feet from the witnesses that were gathered at this boarding school. And one of the little girls started screaming. She was very scared. And then a boy ran into one of the buildings, this is the 70s, grabs a long gun, I'm assuming, a rifle of some sort. He's gonna protect the people, right? And when he came out with the gun to aim it at the craft, the craft shot off to the south. And there were multiple witnesses to this event. We don't, obviously have any photos or video of this event, but that's one of the kind of substantial,

you know, encounters of the 70s Oklahoma. Yeah, interesting, right? So, and then in 2012 there was a surge along the Oklahoma, Texas border. And this is where you can pull up the triangle video that I sent you. And this is a more recent triangle, just giving you an idea of the kind of reports that we get. But we have many cases in the CMS and Oklahoma that are near the Oklahoma Texas border with triangles or Pentagon type, you know, like a pyramid, which was kind of what was reported at the Pentagon. Remember that one that was hovering over the gun that was, was that a diamond or a pyramid? Right?

International flights don't necessarily pop up. It's a very specific FAA beacon that pops up on flight radar 24 and not all flights are required to have it like the I see reports all the time here in Texas on social media, and people are like, I'm in El Paso, and it's like, you realize that there's an international airport right across the border from you. And 90% of those airplanes do not need an FAA transponder on them because they are not coming or going to America.

So sometimes you have to just say, I can't identify it, but you know what? It really does look like a plan. And what the report will often sound like when we get it is, I saw an orb with a fuzzy aura around it, and that right there, that's SpaceX. And I'm guessing about 90 minutes after the launch, you can almost you just have to do the math, right? If you go to look up Google space if you see something like this, just Google SpaceX launches, you're probably going to see a launch from Kennedy or California approximately 90 minutes before you see this. It's the second orbit around the globe. When it starts to look like this. It's higher in the atmosphere, and sometimes just the atmosphere has enough moisture in it and stuff like that and distortion that it just gives it this fuzzy glow. And I can't tell you how many pictures I've gotten sent to me from friends and family and people. They're like, Oh my God, look what I saw. To the point of fact that when you go and click file a report on MUFON, first thing you see is, please do not file a report if you observe any.

Of the identified events below. And the first thing is a space link, Starlink, train of satellites. The second is a falcon nine rocket re entry, yeah, which, which looks looks like, you know, a spinning spiral also, also tends to look like a jellyfish in the sky. Orb

that you just saw on that video depend depends on what angle you're viewing things from and how much ionization, because that's what's happening at that point, is that this heated object is falling through the atmosphere and being ionized by the different layers of atmosphere and its heat. So everybody seeing, we get reports from pilots and all kinds of people like it fools everybody. Like, until you know you don't know. You know what I mean, until you know you don't know you you haven't seen it before. Like, if you haven't been out at night to see it, you're just gonna not know, but they're so pretty and so cool. So if you see something like this, take some video and get it on social media and tell everybody you saw SpaceX well. And you know, one of the, one of the most important things I've hear from people all the time about why they don't report, you know, like, I'm sure somebody else did, maybe, maybe, hopefully, everybody didn't take the attitude you're you're taking right now about right maybe somebody else did. Somebody else reported. I ain't gonna report somebody else. Maybe. Thing is, when you have more than one report, when you have more than one sighting from the same proximity, the same the same 3040, mile radius, even 100 mile radius,

and they're, I saw mine to the east, and they're located to the west, and the person in the West saw it to the east. Now you got something like you're you've begun triangulation. At that point, you can start confirming various things, even by just two sightings being so helpful. So that's what I tell people a lot. I say, you know, it may not seem like a big deal to you, but you might be confirming something, somebody's abduction, or somebody, you know what I mean, like, or you know what I mean, you might be confirming another case. So even if it seems small, like when in doubt, report it. When in doubt, report it. You don't know what it is. You know if you're if you're like, I think it's SpaceX, but maybe it's not just write that in the report. I think it could be SpaceX, but it also made me think maybe not, and we'll decide, we'll we'll get in there and we'll look, and we'll see what we think. But I just where I can't tell you how many times I've had someone in the military say, I wish the other guys that were there with me would file a report. I you know, is there anyone at all? Look, and I'll say, I don't see any of the reports of this event, you know. And they're like, I wish somebody would, you know, just like you would really, you're really helping other people when you file the report, you know. And you can say, I don't need a phone call. I just want this in the record. I just want this in the system. You know, there's a space where you can type a message and you can say, not really interested in talking to anybody. But I just wanted to report this in case it's helpful to somebody, like, just do it. It only takes a few minutes. And you know, one of the cool things is, in the next couple of months, it's not out yet, but we have a new app that's going to be launching in a whole new reporting system that's going to make reporting so much easier for everybody. So just stay tuned out there. You'll see it all over the Facebook pages and all of our social medias. When that launches, that's going to be so cool and awesome.

You're training our new field investigators as well, the new ones that haven't cut their teeth on a space you know, everyone has to see every field investigator needs to get some SpaceX cases from different angles, different times, from launch, you know, right at launch, 90 minutes later, what does it look like later in the night when it's gone around a few times like, you know? So just report it. You're helping us. You're helping somebody. You're at least helping the field investigators. They're learning the young ones, the new ones coming up. Speaking of other SpaceX is, this is the this is the second video, yeah, and it often looks like that. So you get a report. Oh, my God, I saw UFO right above the trees. Well, it's actually really far away, but it looks so cool, and it does look like it's right above the trees, right Yeah. It looks like it's right there, right there, yeah, once once again,

And I will say, if you're out there and you're recording something, record it regular.

Don't do the time lapse, although this is cool, but it makes it harder for me to figure out, or anybody I didn't investigate this case again, like, I don't know it could be bugs. I mean, it could be bugs in a light from the porch, I'm not sure. But this person sits out on this porch at night, watching the mountains, you know, hanging out in the evening, and they say this does not happen all the time, and that this was happened on two they sent two videos. I'm just sharing one, because the other one's pretty much identical, and they set them both up with time lapse for 45 minutes, so I'm not sure what this is. And there are military bases around, and they go into, you know, and one of them kind of, at one point, seems to go off into the distance and make a left. They're calling them orbs. I don't know it's a light. It's really hard. Like, what is that? Why are they all in that one area? Like, why are you, why am I not seeing them go all the way across the sky? If it's illuminated, you should see it continue traveling. Yeah? Like that one right there, which is, I think obviously a plane or something along those, yeah, one of them, yeah. And some are planes, but that's not the actual airplane activity in that area.
