Tech happened, tech happy couple of days, and anyway, yeah, I'm honored, actually, to be working with the museum and holding their disclosure panel, and, and, and if those who don't know, the Roswell Research Library opened their doors to a couple attorneys that were looking for source documentation involving our family's incident about 1112 years ago, when the state, you know, had really looked forward to doing something with our family's incident, because of the impact it had locally.
