First off, let me apologize before I welcome our guest because I did misannounced our guest last week, and I realized it after I walked away from things and started fixing the audio issue in the beginning of the episode while things were still live. That I I misannounced Bob Spearing. I had announced him at the beginning of the show, then at the middle of the show, announced our guest Sylvie Sterling, who who is the Cat Whisper and Lyrid alien expert who we will be having on in the second part of the episode tonight. So I'm sorry, Bob, for introducing you as Sylvie in the second part of the show last week. So with that being said, I'm very happy to welcome our guest this evening. He is actually the host of the Rundown Live, Kristin T. Harris. He covers all kinds of topics. Great interviews over there. He's been doing this since 2011. But in addition, stop on by and follow his page on Facebook, Giantology. That is G-I-A-N-T-O-L-O-G-Y. Giantology. Kristen T. Harris is one of the people who, really, the person who spent years going through and culling through Smithsonian documents and finding news articles, real news articles, things like that about giant skeletons found, stuff like that. So if you see those genuine articles, folks, online, it's more than likely Kristen's work that brought you that. So this is a show. This is a topic that fascinates me, Kristen. The idea of giants, the idea of another race of human humanoid, whatever you want to call it, that is massive and huge and talked about by cultures all over the world. So, welcome to the show for the first time. How are you this evening, ma'am?

Dude, I'm doing great, dude. Your intro reminds me of UHF. Have you ever seen UHF with Weird Al? Oh yeah, and they got Philo, and it's like secrets of the universe, universe, and he's sitting there with like two like electrical conductors, and he's like hold these, and then Weird Al gets shocked, and he's sitting there, and he's like getting electrocuted. You know, your intro had that UHF vibes. I dig it already, and yeah, man, I'm a lot older than I look. I'm approaching 50 years old, and I know I'm a harlot and a heartbreaker. But age is catching up to me, and for a long time, probably since at least you know 2005, I've been digging through the Library of Congress online. All these old. Newspaper articles on giant human skeletons, and it all stemmed from a theological debate I had with my brother about atheism. At that time, basically, my my brother asked me why I believe in Christianity and religious texts, and you know, I don't know. I might have had a few brewskis anyway. I'm like, what about the giants? He's like, there's no proof of giants. And I'm like, well, they'd be in the Library of Congress. And all of a sudden, I started pulling up all these articles, giant human skeletons found. And then I kept finding them. He's like, well, that's just one. And then I found another, and then another, and then another. And before you knew it, I started cutting these and I started publishing these in a news blog called City Now, and City Now is a segment of the Journal Sentinel. And I applied to be a blogger there, and they were dumb enough to give me a blog, and I had some of the most viral articles I think that blog had ever seen. They told me I was a top traffic blogger out of any city knowledge site, worked with a lot of different major newspapers, like a badge of honor. But I also learned and made a lot of mistakes along the way, and eventually they let me go because I'm an independent guy. I'm not Republican. I'm not Democrat. If you ask me, you know, it's two sides of the same coin at the end of the day, and the only things that they agree on is what really destroys our sovereignty and freedom in America. Screw us! Yeah, right, right. At the end of the day, it's like screw the American people. So I started publishing these, and it would be weird, man. I'd publish these articles, and they'd go ultra viral. I'd be, I was getting the dopamine hits because back at the back in the day, remember if you shared an article, it would say Facebook, it would say five likes to six shares. So when you published an article on like like the Journal Sentinel or any major newspaper, you saw how much it was aggregated, how many people liked it, and I'm reading it. I'm like looking at this like like it started out with 30 likes, and I went back. It was it was like 480 likes. And then I looked, and all of a sudden, I had 5000 shares. And I'm like, "What the heck? This stuff's going viral. And all of a sudden, I started reading the comments, and there was like one guy's like, "Yeah, I'm I'm a producer for the TV series Doctor Who. This stuff is crazy. You know, I'm just La Marzulli reached out to me, a guy named Steve Quayle. All these people that started doing this before I did that at that time, not too many people heard of L. A. Marzulli or Steve Quayle. Ancient Aliens wasn't hot. I mean, they're probably on their 13th season right now, and we're talking about almost 20 years ago. So this was before a lot of that, but a lot of those type of individuals from the ancient aliens culture were emailing me and reaching out, and I didn't do aliens. I just didn't. I didn't do UFOs. I didn't do aliens. I listened a little bit of Alex Jones, and that was always taboo. And when I listened to William Cooper, because back then you'd have to go to this like ghetto of the internet to find the forum where they have the audio links. Maybe it was hour of thetime.com.

I don't remember, and I would listen to William Cooper and he talk UFOs, and I'd be like, "Will, that's kind of crazy. Your dad worked on the base, and they turned off the nukes and everything else, which was a little bit weird. So I kind of stayed away from the UFO phenomenon. However, in 2014 or 2015, I can't remember. I gave a presentation at the University of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, at a conference, and at the back of the conference was Chase Klutchki, who she came up to me and was working with La Marzulli at the time. And my my my whole presentation was on giant human skeletons and occultism and the secret society's interest in them, amongst everything else, but specifically dealing with Wisconsin, because we had a lot of effigy mounds here, and a lot of them unearthed large human skeletons. And I have all these newspaper articles. Some of them have pictures of the skeletons. Some of them have historical reference. Some of them talk about in detail finding giants with guns, like a 30-pound musket sitting next to him, a flint, you know, flint stock musket. You know, history about Romans taking down a prince, taking down a 20-foot-tall giant. You know, the the terms like cut them down to size. That's where that some of those things are believed to come from. It's really interesting. So I started publishing these things, and a lot of people started reaching out, and a lot of people within the science community started to really character assassinate me and say, "Well, you know, yeah, there's about 1000 newspaper articles, but it's all fake news. And it's like, "Well, how do you just because you say it's fake doesn't mean it's fake? He's like, "Well, where's the where are the bones? And so then I started looking into it, and a lot of these articles-not all of them, but out of the 1000 I've dug up, there's probably 100 or plus mentions of the Smithsonian of legitimate college like professors locally. We had P.R. Hoy, we had we had. Let's see, who else did we add? We had Charles E. Brown. We had other people who opened up these effigy mounds. They had giant human skeletons in them, and they recorded some of these skeletons between 11 and 15 feet tall. West Bend, Wisconsin; Racine, Wisconsin; Wisconsin. In fact, I went that so I got so interested in this. I literally got my fat ass out of Milwaukee, went to Madison, went to the archeological society and pulled boxes that had an inch of dust on them from the 1800s to read handwritten notes by these individuals. And it was funny because when I when I signed into the card, the last person was in the 90s to sign out this box that I pulled, and of course it was La Marzulli.

You know, I got a lot of contacts, and I started talking to L.A. and L.A. is like, "Yeah, there's like all these elongated skulls. There's all these different types of human human skulls because I was finding not only newspaper articles about giant human skeletons, I was finding them about mass graveyards in the United States found of sprites, and I'm like, "What the hell is a sprite? And I had to look it up, and it was a fairy. And I'm like, "Well, why is it that they're finding hundreds of these human little baby skeletons that are like a foot and a half, two feet tall, you know, in mass graves? I don't know. These were just like peculiar things that kept popping up when I was looking through all these things, and once I started publishing these, all of a sudden the search term "giant human skeleton" was no longer pulling up human giant skeleton articles from the Library of Congress, and so if I took the word "human" out and just kept it as "giant skeleton, then all of a sudden a lot of these came up. But now I had to comb through mammoth skulls skeletons. I had to pull you know large saber tooth tiger skeletons, whatever skeleton they

was large. I had to dig through, and it was made a lot more difficult on me for on me. But I was able to find a lot, you know, a ton of these articles, and so I started looking into the history of it and the mythology of it. And obviously, Genesis six four is the popular verse a lot of people talk about, where it says that there was giants on the earth in those days before and after the flood. You know, obviously Deuteronomy 211, which also was accounts of giants as the Anakims and the Moabites call them the Imams in Deuteronomy 313, and the rest of Galit and Bashan, being the king of Og, gave eye unto the half tribe of Manasha, an area region of Argob. Og was a king and a giant. He was about they believe between 11 and 13 feet tall, and I started going through these, and then I found out it goes even older that the that that Crete itself was known as the land of giants, Gigantus, before it was known as Crete.

It was a deathbed confession by a guy's father who was dying, and he was like, "We found this skull out in the field years ago. It scared the hell out of all of us, so we took it and threw it in the bottom of the well. He went, he dug in the well, and he actively found the skull of what is now known as Dragon Man, which is an actual skull. Folks, feel free to look this up. Like you can find it on Science Alert. This is from ExtremeTech.com. But when you look at the size difference between a on the left the human skull and b dragon man. You're talking like a size like one and a half times the size cranium. Like this is a huge skull, and they they measure the fact that it'd probably be close to nine nine and a half feet tall, something like that.

Skeletons of men living 700 years ago, and they were giants, and they had horns. And guess who shows up? The Smithsonian Institute. And they're like, well, it might mean because it's a mastodon horn or everything else, but it's just funny that they found giants with horns in an area that they called Chamong, and Chamonng means horns, and the giants had horns protruding from their skull, much like what you would see in a science fiction movie with the devil per se.

Even here in Wisconsin, I talk to indigenous tribes, and I'm like, "Well, were giants ever mentioned as part of your history? And he goes, "Oh, we don't talk about that. It's a sacred story.
